Melon Dash, Melon Dash, founder and director of Miracle Swimming Institute (MSI) of Sarasota, Florida and Berkeley, California developed a new way to teach in 1983. Working exclusively with adults who were afraid in water where necessity was the mother of invention, she discovered principles of learning that to this day she has not found anywhere in teaching/education/psychology or swimming literature.

Steve Fenning, Steve is currently coaching with SwimFast in Sunrise, FL. He is also owner of the SwimAmerica program in Vero Beach, FL. Steve has been coaching and teaching swimming for over 36 years.

Brian McGuire, Brian has been coaching swimming for the past 18 years. He is a 3-time winner of the NIC-10 Swimming Coach of the Year award. Currently, he is the girls head coach at Hononegah High School and the boys head coach at Boylan High School. Before starting McGuire Aquatic Club, Brian coached the Woodstock Dolphins and successfully grew their team from 80 to over 250 swimmers. As coach of the Beloit Aquatic Team, Brian was one of the youngest head coaches ever in the State of Wisconsin.
